The upcoming April show was discussed and committee chairs reported.

Ring Set Up Chair, Richard Esquibar will need help setting up Group Rings.

Catalogue sales: each member will be asked to work at the sales table for one hour. Ring times will be published within four days prior to the show and the sales table schedule will be set up at that time. Catalogues will also be sold in the tent building.

Treasurer, Sue Bachman reported that dues are payable now.

The following committee chairs reported:

Petie Schreeter will replace Joyce Martin for 2008 and 2009 on the judges selection committee.

Newsletter: Trish Watson will publish our newsletter electronically (except for mailing a copy to Jean Heath). Members are asked to give updated e-mail addresses to Trish.

Public Education Chair, Trish Watson reported that nothing is happening now, but the legislative bill proponents have until June. She will keep us up dated.

Legislative Liaison, Carolyn Alexander reported that all is quiet for now. She said to check the AKC website for current updates.

Bay Area Judges Assoc. Liaison, Phil Freilich reported that most judges want bigger venues with several days of shows. Many don't want to do small shows with limited breeds.

Breed Referral Chair, Chris Tuthill reported that she received calls periodically. We need to update our list. Darlene will send out a Word Document for members to fill out with current information.

Calendar issues are current. The premium list for our April show will be mailed next week. Dr. Orlandi's Seminar will be listed in our premium list on page 3. Darlene doesn't know if it will be in the Sacramento KC premium list.

There was no Old Business.

Match Chair, Petie Schreeder passed out flyers for the upcoming March 8, Match to be held at the Dixon May Fairgrounds. Judges are needed. Our Match is a qualifier with the AKC for the club's All Group Show. Darlene urged the membership to support the Match.

Darlene reported that Coyote Hills KC will hold a Match the following weekend, March 15, at CA State Hayward. Judges are needed.

The Premium List for our April show was discussed. Entry fees have been raised due to an increase in the AKC fee (\$3.50/dog for the first and second entry). Rally classes cannot be used as a second class.

Restrictions: Bred by Exhibitor Class

Sweepstakes Classes – exhibitor must own the dog shown in the class and/or group.

Handlers are o.k. to show dogs in all other classes.

Ringside Mentoring: This is a qualifier and Darlene suggested that breed clubs offer this.

Robin Alexander was introduced and told us that she has shown Soft Coated Wheaten Terriers since 1985. She is a Web Site Designer and will do a web site for NCTA. She is a former member of our club and presently Treasurer for the National Soft Coated Wheaten Terrier Club.

AB1634 NEWS

Well, you knew they weren't going to go as far as June without a fight and here it comes. First earlier this year they tried to bring up mandatory spay neuter through "rescue vigils" in San Jose but we nipped that in the bud with the assistance of NCTA club members, the CDOC and its board, members of the hunting and gun clubs, the American Sporting Dog alliance, the No Kill Shelter group, the Santa Clara dog training club members, and many of our own NCTA members and judges who organized a last minute counter demonstration and forced the organizers to publically announce the "vigil" had nothing to do with the notorious mandatory spay/neuter legislation. We were noticed by the vice mayor and council members, and got tremendous support from the passing traffic too.

Another San Jose rescue vigil in early March extended and invite to the dog breeder community and the CDOC, this time the subject was off the table from the start. It also turned out the "rescue" activists who have been so loudly attacking the local fancy participants are not even from San Jose or Santa Clara County, the vast majority of them are from Hollister and have no input to our elected officials, but they bring their rescue animals to our council members rescue events. . If this happens in your community be sure to find out where the "rescue" groups come from that show up to pressure your officials.

In Huntington Beach the local dog fancy supporters turned out in numbers for the council meetings when the Mancuso supporters tried to bring mandatory spay/neuter there and soundly defeated that attempt despite strong support from members of the elected council and the mayor. When we show up in numbers and keep showing up, get the local press to cover us too it carries tremendous weight. The majority of voters are on our side. It is also important that if you hear an animal advisory



committee is forming that you find a fancy member who can serve on it and promote that person with the mayor or one the council members. In San Jose the shelter screens applicants so we have to trust the animal rights person in the shelter to contact applicants. So far this year the Scottie breeder attempting membership in San Jose has been blocked with stalling in contacting him. Don't let stalling tactics stop you. Don't just put in an application, attend the meetings and ask why you have not been considered. Get on those committees at the city and county levels. One person on a committee can keep this controlled, several members can vote it out before it is presented to elected officials.

The CDOC have been very active at the state level sponsoring dog friendly safety legislation so that our groups don't seem to be strangers to the legislature and laws that benefit pet owners and encourage pet and dog ownership are proposed not just HSUS and PETA legislation. The group that brought us Lassie at the Legislature against AB1634 has become active promoting the NOKILL shelter movement. We are building a good solid coalition against the animal rights no pet activists. We need your continued support and help to keep all these

groups going. They are coming after us because we are effective in stopping them so please read the emails that our lobby groups send you and now they are established GIVE THEM MONEY. I have included some of the latest articles from various groups that have come in this week in this newsletter.

DOG CLUB DIRECTORIES ARE THE NEW ENFORCEMENT TOOL

From the CDOC

Some people have assumed that since new laws offer some exemptions - for the time being - for people who show dogs, they will not be affected. Responsible people who breed as well as show are more concerned about the welfare of the dogs as a whole.

To demonstrate the ability to get an exemption for your show dog, some California cities are asking that people seeking to license their intact dogs provide a copy of a Dog Club Directory with their name in it as evidence. And of course, that gives the enforcement body an up-to-date list of all the other people they can go after.

It's important to remember these laws are being passed as ordinances which will generate revenue very quickly for the municipalities passing them. That means active enforcement against people who can be easily identified, who live in neighborhoods where it is safe for enforcement people to travel and who are likely to have the money to pay huge licensing differentials and fines.

We would urge dog clubs to immediately issue membership cards so their members are not forced to turn over information on the entire club to get an exemption. And please write to the AKC and urge them to abandon the requirement for addresses in the dog show catalogs.

Animal control groups know responsible dog people are not the problem. But they have promised lots of monies to their cities and we are the people who are easiest to find.



Elected Officials, Please Take Note Of This Poll

A recent poll of the readers of Parade Magazine, America's most widely read publication, shows that 91 percent of its readers oppose laws or ordinances that mandate spaying and neutering of pets.

Parade is both the highest circulation magazine in America and also the most mainstream, having built an empire as a Sunday supplement to more than 400

newspapers and attracting a reported 71 million readers a week. If elected officials want to know what will "play in Peoria," Parade is Peoria. It's readers are ordinary people from all walks of life, and do not represent any special interest group. They are your neighbors and constituents.

The magazine published an article about mandatory spay and neuter laws in its March 16, 2008, issue, following enactment of an ordinance in Los Angeles. A poll accompanied the article with the following question: "Should owners be required to sterilize their pets?"

There were 50,577 responses:

91% voted no (45,824 votes)

9% voted yes (4,753 votes)

We ask elected officials to pay close attention to the results of this poll, which has great value because of the mainstream readership of Parade. Officials are being bombarded with political pressure from animal rights groups to pass mandatory sterilization ordinances and laws, as well as with reams of contradictory information. The Parade poll says what the people who voted for elected officials are thinking.

Many communities are considering these kinds of spay/neuter ordinances now, including Dallas and Santa Barbara. Other communities have passed these ordinances. In California, legislation is expected to be reintroduced in the near future mandating statewide pet sterilization.

The American Sporting Dog Alliance asks everyone who reads this report to send it to the elected officials who represent you in your city, town, township, county and state. It is urgent that we let them know what the vast majority of the voters think about this issue. We also hope you will send this report to all of your friends, and cross-post it on message boards.

With only weeks to the final deadline, AB 1634, the mandatory sterilization bill, is heating up in the California Legislature and the dirt is flying from our opponents.

They are back at work attempting to pass AB 1634. Assemblyman Lloyd Levine the author of the legislation is scheduled to meet with members of the Senate Local Government Committee next week to press for its passage.

Meanwhile, Judie Mancuso, Campaign Director for AB 1634, was lobbying in the Capitol this week. She has stooped to attacking PetPAC supporters as “underground breeders” “including many who evade current tax laws.”

Can you believe the desperate lies they are attempting to spin? Mancuso and Levine believe PetPAC stands in the way of the passage of AB 1634: and they are right.

AKC NEEDS CATALOG REQUIREMENT CHANGES

We knew it would only be a matter of time before the Animal Rights groups started using our catalogs to target us. As you can see from the CDOC article reprinted here that time has come. Please help your club become less of a target by lobbying the AKC to change the catalog address requirements and get your clubs, locals and nationals, to issue membership cards.
